



> When to go: November-December. Avoid the monsoon and peak summer_

Who to do it with: GETHNAA, i.e. General Thimmaiah National Academy of Adventure (www. gethnaa.org), is an autonomous body formed by the Government of Karnataka to promote rock climbing, forest treks and adventure activities in the state.

Getting there: Jet Airways flies regularly to instructor and learn wave-style riding, freestyle Bengaluru from several Indian cities such as Mumbai, or jumps at Swami's Bay, Lands End lagoon and Delhi, Ahmedabad, Kolkata and Chennai. Hampi is a Fisherman's Cove. Snorkelling, kayaking and stand up six-hour drive (343 km) from Bengaluru paddleboarding are also offered.

KITEBOARDING NEAR RAMESHWARAM Kiteboarding is an extreme surface water sport that

combines aspects of wakeboarding, windsurfing, surfing, paragliding and gymnastics. The power of the wind is harnessed with a large controllable power kite that propels the surfer, perched on a kiteboard, across the water. The perfect conditions—steady. wind speed, scanty rainfall and a large stretch of deep blue sea - can be found just off India's east coast, in southern Tamil Nadu. When to go: Catch the southern winds in the summer (April-September) and northern winds in winter (October-March).

Who to do it with: Quest Expeditions (thekitesurfingholiday.com) offers several extreme water sports across India including diving, kayaking and kitesurfing.

Getting there: Jet Airways flies regularly from Chennai to Madurai, from where Rameshwaram is a three-hour drive (169 km).

SKIING IN GULMARG

CNN ranks Gulmarg as the seventh-best ski destination in Asia. And for good reason. At 13,780 ft, Kongdoori, on the shoulder of Mt Affarwat, is the highest skiing point in the Himalayas The world's highest ski lift whisks adventure-seekers to the upper reaches, from where they can ski or snowboard down freshly powdered slopes. The Indian Institute of Skiing and Mountaineering (IISM), a snowball's throw away from The Khyber Resort, offers certified instructors, quality skiing equipment and snow gear for those interested in learning as well as shared accommodation.

With 1,350 caves stretching over nearly 400 km, Meghalaya has some of the deepest, longest and largest labyrinths of caves in the Indian subcontinent. Also known as spelunking, caving gives people a chance to see a rarely explored realm of stalagmites, stalactites, candles, cave curtains and cave pearls, which have been formed over thousands of years. For tourists, Maswmai Cave near Cherrapunjee in the Khasi Hills, is a good introduction. For more serious explorations, head to Shnongrim Ridge in the Jaintia Hills, riddled with cave passages like Krem Tynghen, Krem Umthloo, Krem Chympe and Krem Liat Prah, the longest
